

## **HENRY F. ARNOLD, FASLA, Founding Principal Emeritus**

Henry Arnold graduated from the University of Pennsylvania's School of Fine Arts with a bachelor of landscape architecture degree and studied forestry at Penn State. He has been practicing landscape architecture for nearly five decades—ten of those years were with the Vermont office of Dan Kiley as associate/partner landscape architect. He subsequently moved to Princeton, New Jersey, where he continues the practice of landscape architecture at Arnold Associates with his partner, Stephen Lederach. The firm's practice focuses on urban sites, with special expertise in developing and using new urban tree planting techniques.

Named a "Distinguished Artist" by the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, Arnold's work is well known among his peers and has brought him a number of honors and awards. In 1980, he received the American Publishers Award for the best book in architecture and urban planning for *Trees in Urban Design*, now in its second edition. Other accolades include design recognition and honorable mention in the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Competition (1981) and the Pershing Square Competition (1986). Most notably, he is a Fellow of the American Society of Landscape Architects.

A registered landscape architect in a number of states, Arnold is a frequent lecturer; has taught urban design at Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, and has served as consultant to major developers, corporations, and the Ministry of National Development in Singapore.
